

Heartland Hope 2018 Annual Report


Our mission is to be more than a pantry by providing clients with resources to be food secure and self-sufficient in a hope-filled environment.

In 2018, every client received one-on-one care from a Client Service Specialist at our South Omaha location; providing a personalized touch to families in need as they work toward self-sufficiency. Many of our clients have never had to ask for help before and are not aware of the resources available to them. Referrals connect families to agencies and services such as: medical care, housing assistance, utility assistance and financial coaching, which helps to prevent homelessness.

Families in need choose a week's supply of groceries including: milk, frozen meat and fresh produce, to prepare well-balanced meals at home.

Families that struggle to provide food often do not have funds to buy clothing for their growing children or for work. Clients are able to receive the clothing they need at no cost.


